

State Basketball and Cheerleading held in March 2023 saw 1,218 athletes and partners competing for the gold! Also, at our newly restructured Fall Games we had 1,056 athletes and partners competing in swimming and bocce. Sharing numbers like this brings us so much joy and excitement as the inclusive movement continues to grow across the state.

The vision of Special Olympics Arizona over the next 5 years is to grow to serve more than 25,000 athletes and partners, grow developmental sports programs, increase trained coaches and engage families at a higher level than ever before. REBECCA STONE

Rebecca currently serves as the superintendent of Lake Havasu Unified School District #1. She started her career as a special education teacher where she championed all students with diverse abilities as they worked to meet their potential. She has worked with Special Olympics for the past 15 years supporting student athletes and organizing events. She is proud of the positive impact Special Olympics has on athletes, families, coaches, and the community.

CHIEF TROY STIRLING

Chief Troy Stirling joined the Lake Havasu City Police Department in 1997, after serving almost 3-years with the Mohave County Sheriff's Office, and promoted through the ranks. During his 28-year law enforcement career, he has worked in the patrol and criminal investigations units, and became a use of force, Taser, and driving instructor where he was able to train officers for several years. He promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 2006 where he had the opportunity to supervise a patrol squad and oversee the full implementation of the department's body worn camera program. He also had the opportunity to be the supervisor of the Criminal Investigations Unit and the Professional Standards Unit. In 2015, after being promoted to Lieutenant,

he was assigned as the Academy Commander for the Western Arizona Law Enforcement Training Academy where he oversaw the academy operations until being promoted to Captain in 2016. As the Support Division Captain he oversaw the Professional Standards Unit, Records Unit, Jail Unit and the Communications Center. He took over as the Operations Division Captain in November of 2021 where he oversaw the Patrol and Investigations Bureaus. In December of 2022 he was appointed as the Police Chief and is honored to lead the men and women of the Lake Havasu City Police Department.

Chief Stirling holds a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice and a Master's degree in Public Administration and is a 2018 graduate of the 271st session of the FBI National Academy.

Chief Stirling came to Lake Havasu City in 1983 and is a graduate of the LHHS class of 88'. He is an avid Pickleball player, and he and his wife, Kim, enjoy volunteering their time with various community organizations and they have a 23-year old son and a 32-year old daughter.


