#### A Letter from our CEO:

Looking back over the past year, I can truly say 2019 was a year of great progress for Special Olympics Arizona (SOAZ). The organization grew in nearly every aspect, due to tremendous support from community partners. The most influential growth took place with the implementation of Unified Sports programs in an additional 111 schools, taking the overall total to 261. This growth means the message of inclusion and acceptance is reaching thousands of youth in Arizona. Unified sports pairs those with and without intellectual disabilities on the same teams together to not only benefit from physical fitness, through sports training and competition, but to benefit socially and mentally. Unified sports has proven results of school culture change, increased confidence and true friendships.

Special Olympics Arizona would not be the organization it is without its volunteers. In 2019, 22,856 volunteers freely gave time as a day of event volunteer, youth leader, Games Management Team (GMT) member, Law Enforcement Torch Run (LETR) member, health clinician or coach. Volunteers ensured athletes had high quality training and competitive opportunities in 20 different sports, raised funds so athletes may compete at no cost and provided free health screenings by certified health professionals.

SOAZ was also honored to be recognized in November as a "Starting Five" organization by Phoenix Suns Charities and Devin Booker receiving \$100,000 towards an inclusive space in the new Special Olympics Arizona Office and Distribution Center. The space will allow for athlete and youth leadership trainings, coaches trainings, Unified music practices and anything else we can dream up.

I believe Special Olympics Arizona to be a special organization, an organization of athletes, volunteers, partners and staff proud of their past and excited about their future. I am grateful to all those who made our accomplishments possible this year.

As we work together to build a strong future, we will all continue to live our values, and apply the high standards embodied in the Special Olympics mission each and every day.

My name is Conner Smith, and I am 26 years of age. I have been a Special Olympic athlete for the past 21 years. My first ever Special Olympics sport I played was soccer. My first coach in Special Olympics was Kathy Reeves, I always called her Miss Kathy, and I am thankful for her because, she was always patient with me at soccer practice. She was a happy coach. During my very first soccer season, I made friends with John Fisher, Curtis Champagne, and Chris Troy. We are still friends today.

When I was younger, I did not get invited to birthday parties, but having my Special Olympics friends, I always was invited to their parties, and we had so much fun.

I then became involved with other sports besides soccer, and my friendships began to grow. I played basketball, went bowling, and was on the swim team, and track and field.

By the time I reached Jr High School, it was difficult to fit in, to talk to people, and make friends, I did not try out for sports. I had the physical ability to play, but it was hard to concentrate, focus, and think quickly. Being able to participate in Yuma Special Olympics have the chance to play sports, and learn new skills. In High School I did make some friends, and they accepted me for who I am, and we are still friends, even though we graduated.

Since becoming a Yuma Special Olympic Athlete, I have had many opportunities for participation in sports that I love, and have been able to travel to competitions, and speak about what Special Olympics means to me.

I have met NFL quarterback for the New Orleans Saints Drew Brees, Jimmy Graham, Mark Ingram at the NFL free 60 experience in February 2015. It was a chance to meet professional athletes, and play football with them. Our Yuma Athletes have traveled to Phoenix for a basketball clinic with the Phoenix Suns. I have had the privilege to carry the torch for Opening Ceremonies, for LETR with our law enforcement officers.

My proudest moment was being selected for the Arizona Unified Basketball Team. We traveled to Abu Dhabi, in March of 2019 to represent the United States at World Games. Our team placed 4th out of 31 teams. Special Olympics Arizona has given me all these opportunities.

I want to help other athletes have fun, and be their friends, and make sure that they are not bullied.




